

SSO:USA 2018 Student Video Contest Information and Official Rules

Deadline for Submission: February 16, 2019

The Society for the Study of Occupation: USA invites student members to participate in the “What is Occupational Science?” Video Contest.

Who can submit? Any occupational science or occupational therapy student

How many submissions? One per student or group (up to 3 students within a group submission)

Length of video: No more than 5 minutes

Content: Answer the question: “What is Occupational Science? and How does Occupational Science benefit humanity?”

Technical requirements: Upload to YouTube. In the privacy settings for the video, select “public” or “unlisted”

Awards:

First place*	Video will be recognized at AOTA SSO booth and SSO Annual Conference Free SSO conference registration* 1 year student membership in SSO*
Second place*	Video will be recognized at AOTA SSO booth and SSO Annual Conference 1 year student membership in SSO*
Third place*	Video will be recognized at AOTA SSO booth and SSO Annual Conference

Procedure:

1. Create a video that answers the question “What is Occupational Science? and How does Occupational Science benefit humanity?” within 5 minutes, according to the above technical requirements
2. Complete and submit the following forms by February 16, 2019 (all forms can be accessed on the SSO:USA website)
 - a. Signed entry form
 - b. Signed release form for each person who is shown in the video

*for all students (up to 3) in the group that created the winning video

3. Submit an embedded link from a video hosting system (YouTube)
4. Entrants will receive notification if submission meets requirements for consideration
5. All entrants will be notified by April 1, 2019 whether their entry is an award-winner or not

Official Rules:

1. Entries that do not comply with the Official Rules (within this section) or do not complete steps 1-3 above will be disqualified.
2. No entry can contain any third-party copyrighted material, other than elements owned by the entrant(s).
3. No entry can contain third-party trademarks or logos.
4. Use of the SSO:USA logo is not permitted.
5. If any individuals depicted are a minor, entrant must obtain the signature of the individual's parent or guardian on a Video Release form.
6. Entries cannot contain sexually explicit content, vulgar language, or biased information.
